

Donal Ó Drisceoil: biography

Donal Ó Drisceoil lectures in the School of History at University College Cork.

His publications include *Censorship in Ireland, 1939-45: Neutrality, Politics and Society* (1996), *Peadar O'Donnell* (2001), and, as co-editor, *Politics and the Irish Working Class, 1930-1945* (2005). With Diarmuid Ó Drisceoil, he has published *The Murphy's Story: the History of Lady's Well Brewery, Cork* (1997 and 2006); *Serving A City: The Story of Cork's English Market* (2005 and 2011), and *Fifty Years Have Flown: The History of Cork Airport* (2011). He was joint editor of *Saothar: Journal of Irish Labour History* (2004-2010), *Radical History Review* (Spring, 2009), and historical advisor on the film *The Wind that Shakes the Barley* (2006), winner of the Palme d'Or at the 2006 Cannes Film Festival.

He is currently completing a a history of media and literary censorship in twentieth-century Ireland, a biography of Cork revolutionary Tadhg Barry, and a co-authored history of Beamish & Crawford brewery, Cork.
